

Service Learning LIST 4093

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This is a course in service learning. Hands on service learning will be coupled with academics perspectives.

Objectives

1. To provide an opportunity for students to gain work experience in their field.
2. To introduce students to perspectives regarding nonprofit organizations
3. To develop one's ability to understand and to integrate various interdisciplinary perspectives about nonprofit organizations into real life situations.
4. To further one's ability to think critically about practices of nonprofit organizations.
5. To help students develop strategies to improve nonprofit organization functioning.

Requirements

Students will engage in community service. Students enrolled in the course for one credit hour will need to complete 20 hours of community service, students enrolled in the course for two credit hours will need to complete 40 hours of community service, and students enrolled in the course for three credit hours will need to complete 60 hours of community service.
